







- More than 28,000 students (6,000 graduate students) and 3,300 faculty and staff

Feasibility Study - Project Objectives


- Provide the appropriate spaces for a variety of cultural, educational, social and recreational programs, which will allow UNLV students, faculty, staff and community members to develop a better connection to the University, thereby enhancing the University's recruitment and retention efforts.
- Support the University's mission by creating hubs of dynamic campus and community activity, providing a home for many of the University's diverse programs and services.
- Enhance the University's goal of becoming a more residential campus, by providing the appropriate facilities, services and programs to make the campus a residential location of choice for both students and faculty/staff.
- Enrich the overall "college experience" for all UNLV students, ultimately encouraging greater interaction outside the classroom with faculty and enhancing alumni involvement and support.





- McDermott Complex = 120,000 Gross
 Square Feet
- Opened in 1975
- 1975 Student Body = 7,500 Students
- Shared Facility with P.E. and Athletic Department









Facility Limitations

- Not a Student Recreation Center
- Limited Recreation Amenities
- Lack of Natural Light
- Multiple Entrances
- Limited Hours for Recreation
- Major Maintenance Issues

- Opened in 1968
- 1968 Student Body = 5,000 Students
- Expanded B&N bookstore in 2000 (20k sq. ft)







Student Union

- \$50 million in two phases
- \$275 per square foot
- \$370 total project cost/sf
- Changes during design
 - theatre (\$2m)
 - ballroom (\$500k)
 - computer lab (\$500k)
 - switch from renovation (\$3m)
 - Double digit cost inflation



Recreation Center

- \$56m Student Recreation and Wellness Center
 - \$250 per square foot
 - \$305 total project cost/sf
 - Added wellness center (\$7.5m)
 - Double digit cost inflation
 - Outdoor Pool is the next phase BRAILSFORD & DUNLAVEY






- Total Square Feet = 189,000
 - Wellness Area = 23,780 square feet
 - **Recreation Section =** 165,465 square feet including:
 - Fitness Space = 32,468 square feet (*Cardiovascular room, fitness mezzanine, five multipurpose rooms, and racquetball courts*)
 - **Natatorium**= 14,143 square feet
 - **Public Spaces** = 12,984 square feet (*Lobby, two meeting rooms, control desk, and bistro*)
 - **Gymnasium Space** = 44,432 square feet (*Track, four-court gym, and two multi-purpose activity (MAC) courts*)
 - Steel-Framed Elaborate skin system of masonry block, glass, precast concrete and metal panels

























Second Floor Plan










Third Floor Plan




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






Enrollment Projections Provided by UNLV Institutional Research
