B&D Recreation Planning Standards

- 8.5 to 10.5 Gross Square Feet Per Student
 - ▶ Small Residential Campuses Are Higher
 - ► Large, Urban Non-traditional Campuses Are Lower
- Add 1 to 1.5 Gross Square Feet Per Employee
- Add 5 to 7.5 Gross Square Feet Per Alumni / Community Member
- Add for Non-redundant Academic & Athletic Spaces
- Subtract Usable Existing Spaces but Consider Sport Clubs & Efficiency of Existing Space



B&D Recreation Planning Standards

- 8.5 to 10.5 Gross Square Feet Per Student
 - ▶ Projected Enrollment Growth



▶ Residential / Commuter Mix



► Unique Cultural Considerations

Multiple Campuses

Demographics (FT/PT Mix, etc.)





B&D Recreation Planning Standards

- Weight & Fitness = 1 Net Square Foot Per Student
 - ▶ Gender mix
 - ▶ Commuter mix
- Group Exercise = .5 Net Square Foot Per Student
 - ► Adjust for sport club and passive recreation use
 - ▶ Gender mix
- Wellness & Social Spaces are additional

- Compare Similar Institutions (Size, History, Enrollment, etc.)
 - Facility Size and Space Types vs. Usage Patterns
 - B&D Projections vs. Actual Data
- Identify Quantifiable Rec Sports Facility and Operational Trends

Weight & Fitness	0.7	0.6	1
Multi-Purpose (Group Ex, Martial Arts, etc.)	0.3	0.4	0.5

- 5.4M SF Total Facilities Operated by Big Ten Rec Sports
- More than half of these facilities are over 30 years old and have not had any major renovations since they opened.
- 7 universities are currently planning renovation or new construction and 3 have facilities under construction.


